quilted craft patterns by Laurraine Yuyama

finished size: 6 x 5 inches (not including handle)

CoffeeMug & HotCocoa templates included!

Materials

- 5 x 8" cotton for teacup top
- 8 x 8" cotton for teacup bottom
- 8 x 12" cotton for lining
- 8 x 14" cotton for rim & handle
- 12 x 15" muslin for quilt backing & tea tag
- 9 x 15" polyester batting
- 16" length of ribbon
- 8½" of ¾" cotton piping for handle
- 7" zipper & scrap of cream felt
- 8½" length of strong twine
- template plastic & fusible web
- polymer clay (optional)

Tools

- fabric marker or stamp & ink pad for fabric
- scissors, straight pins & masking tape
- chalk pencil or water soluble marker
- rotary cutter & mat for bias strips
- turning tool such as a chopstick
- safety pin attached to string

Stitches & Terms



RUNNING STITCH



LADDER STITCH

BIAS: cut on the diagonal at a 45° angle

TACK: secure with a few stitches

TOPSTITCH: sew through all layers (quilt)

TEACUP POUCH

finished size: 6 x 5 inches (not including handle)

*This Teacup Pouch pattern was originally featured in **Pretty Little Purses & Pouches** by Lark Books in 2008. This pattern booklet also includes templates for CoffeeMug & HotCocoa pouches, and detailed instructions for installing the zipper and making the handle.*

Use $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance unless otherwise stated.

Please read all of the instructions before starting your project.

Cutting

From 5 x 8" piece of cotton, cut:

2 - teacup tops

From 8 x 8" piece of cotton, cut:

2 - teacup bottoms

From 8 x 12" piece of cotton, cut:

2 - teacup linings

From 8 x 14" piece of cotton, cut:

1 - 2 x 8" bias strip for handle, 2 - 2 x 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips for rim

From muslin cut:

2 - 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 9" squares for quilt backing, 2 - 3 x 3" squares for tag

From batting, cut:


2 - 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 9" squares

From cream felt scrap, cut:

1 - tea tag


From ribbon, cut:

2 - 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ " lengths




Tea Tag

1. Write or stamp the word tea in the centre of the 2 squares of muslin using a marker or stamp pad for fabric. Let dry and iron fusible web to the back. Cut out the tag shape from template plastic. Centre the template over the word and cut out the tags.
TIP: Pigma Micron pens and VersaCraft ink pads are waterproof & fade proof.




2. Fold the twine in half and knot the end. Place a muslin tag on each side of the felt tag & insert the knotted end between the layers. Iron to fuse. Using matching thread, *topstitch* 1/8" from edge starting at the top. *TIP: Replace the tea tag with a polymer clay coffee bean or marshmallow bead.*




Finishing


19. Fingerpress the seams open at the rim. Reach through the opening, unzip the zipper all the way and turn right side out. Reach through the opening again to push out zipper & shape edges of teacup.




20. Using matching thread, sew the opening closed using a *ladder stitch* and tuck neatly into pouch. Attach the tea tag to the zipper pull. Now it can always be tea time! *TIP: Instructions are the same for CoffeeMug & HotCocoa pouches.*



17. Ensure that the zipper is still open halfway. Align quilted sides & pin. Sew from the rim to the bottom of the quilted side reinforcing the handle. Repeat on the opposite side.




18. Match up the linings and sew from rim to bottom on each side leaving a 3" opening at the bottom. Trim excess handle & zipper.




Handle

3. Fold the *bias* strip in half lengthwise and sew using a $\frac{3}{8}$ " allowance. Trim seam to $\frac{1}{4}$ ". Pass the safety pin with string attached through the tube and attach the pin to the other end of the tube. Pull the pin back through turning the fabric tube right side out.




4. Pass the safety pin through tube again and attach it to the end of the piping that has been wrapped with masking tape. Pull the piping through the tube & trim. *TIP: You can use several 18" strands of yarn folded in half in place of piping.*




Quilted Sides

5. You will be making 2 quilted sides. With right sides together, sew together teacup top & bottom. Press seam open. Using a chalk pencil, transfer the quilting lines onto the pieced sides.




6. Place on top of batting & backing. Topstitch along the seam to secure. Quilt using the chalk lines as a guide. Place ribbon over seam and topstitch in place.




Assembly


15. The side that the zipper pull is at when the zipper is closed is the side that the handle goes on. Position handle inside the cup between the quilted sides in a circle shape and tack in place using $\frac{1}{8}$ " seam allowance.




16. With right sides together, pull the linings and the quilted sides in opposite directions. Open the zipper halfway. Line up the edges and *tack* between the seam of the quilted rim and the seam of the lining at both ends. Check alignment.




13. Place the other quilted side face down on top of the zipper, again aligning the crease of the rim strip with the edge of the zipper. Pin & sew along the right edge of zipper moving the zipper as you sew.




7. With right sides together, attach the rim strip to the top of the quilted side. Trim allowance at the top leaving an extra $\frac{1}{4}$ " of batting & backing.



14. Move both linings under the side not being sewn, tuck the batting neatly under the rim fabric and stitch in the ditch under rim. Repeat on the other side. Press the linings open.




8. Fold the raw edge to the stitched seam and press to crease. Trim excess batting & backing along remaining sides. Repeat steps 5 - 8 for the other quilted side.




Zipper


9. Place a piece of lining face up with the straight edge on the left. Align the zipper face up with the zipper pull at the bottom.




10. Place a quilted side face down on top so that the crease of the rim strip is aligned with the edge of the zipper, fold batting out of the way and pin all layers together.





11. Sew along the left edge of the zipper using a zipper foot or regular foot with the needle at far right position and stop just before the zipper pull with the needle in down position. Lift the presser foot and open the zipper. Continue sewing and check the seam.




12. Flip the layers so that the quilted side and the lining are wrong sides together and the zipper is facing up and on the right. Place on top of the second piece of lining with right sides up and the straight edges on the right.








COFFEE MUG POUCH





COFFEE MUG POUCH




coffee mug - lining

BOOKLET ASSEMBLY

Instructions for assembling the pattern booklet.

Method #1 (best results)

Print the cover on 8½ x 11" high quality professional matte photo paper using a borderless setting. Print the page with Stitches & Terms on the back of the cover page. Print the page with cutting instructions, and the page with steps 1, 2, 19 & 20 on opposite sides of the same paper. Print the page with 17, 18, 3 & 4 and the page with steps 5, 6, 15, 16 on opposite sides of the same paper. Print the page with 13, 14, 7 & 8 and the page with steps 9 -12 on opposite sides of the same paper. Fold so that pages are in the correct order. Tie pages together with a couple stitches at the fold.

Method #2

Print each page on a different piece of paper. Layer pages on top of each other as follows: Cover face down ; page with Stitches & Terms face up; page with cutting instructions face down; page with steps 1, 2, 19 & 20 face up; page with steps 17, 18, 3 & 4 face down; page with steps 5, 6, 15, 16 face up; page with steps 13, 14, 7 & 8 face down; page with steps 9 - 12 face up. Fold all pages in half towards you and tie pages together with a couple stitches at the fold.

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
