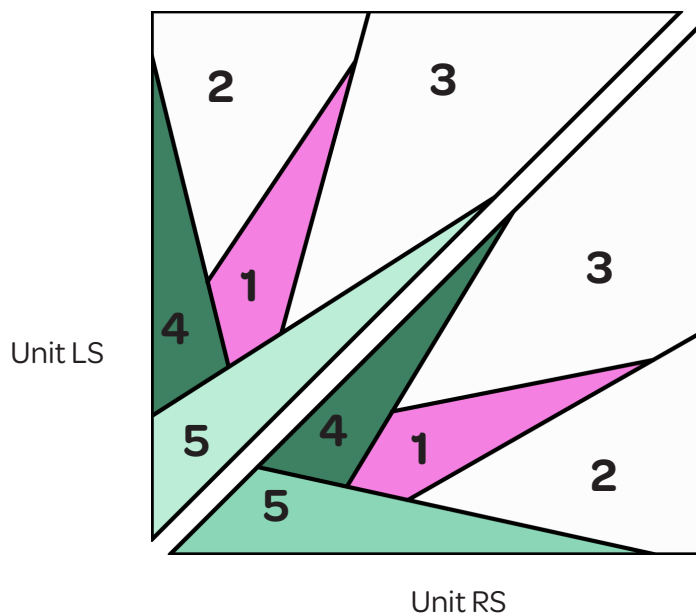
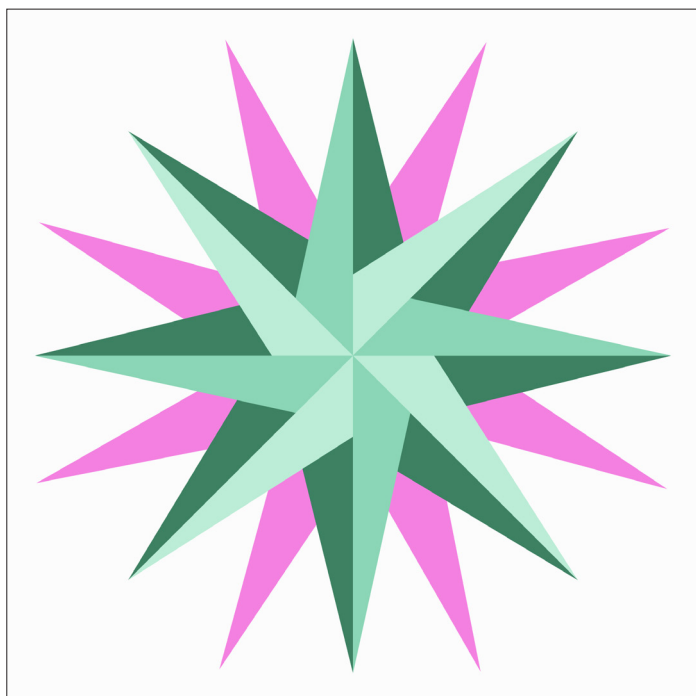


Starburst

3/8 yard for background

4 Fat Eights

* All seams are 1/4".

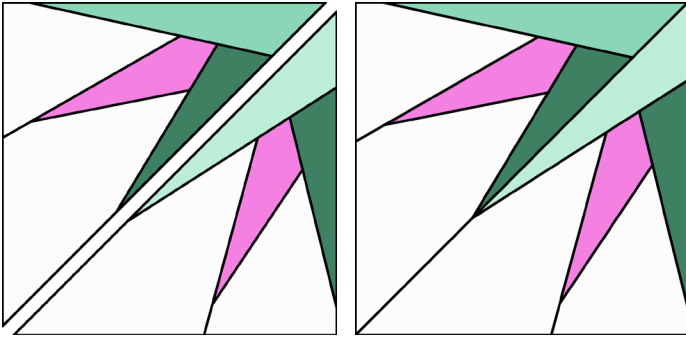

Paper Piecing Instructions:

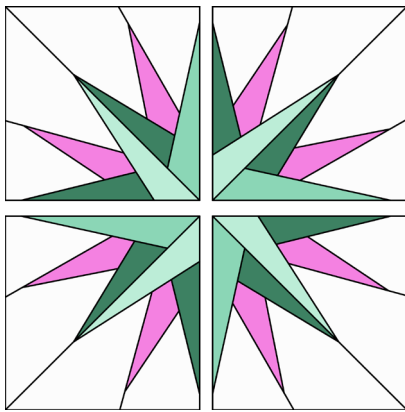
1. Print 4 copies of the foundation patterns for RS Unit and LS Unit.
2. Decide on your fabric colors and label each section on the pattern according to your fabric choice.
3. Cut fabric according to cutting chart and layout on your table space in the order you will sew the fabric to the foundation papers.
4. Sew the foundation papers starting with section 1. Use the glue stick to glue the wrong side of the fabric to the paper on the back side covering the seam allowance around section 1.
5. Fold back the paper using a piece of cardboard or thin plastic along the line between section 1 and 2.
6. Trim the fabric by laying the Add-A-Quarter ruler along the folded paper and trimming.
7. Lay your section 2 fabric under the section 1 fabric with right sides together along the seam allowance you trimmed in the previous step.
8. Fold the paper flat and sew on the bold line between section 1 and 2.
9. Iron the sewn section open.
10. Continue with the next section by repeating step 7 through 10.
11. After the paper pattern is complete, iron flat and trim on the outside line. Leave the paper on.

Block Assembly:

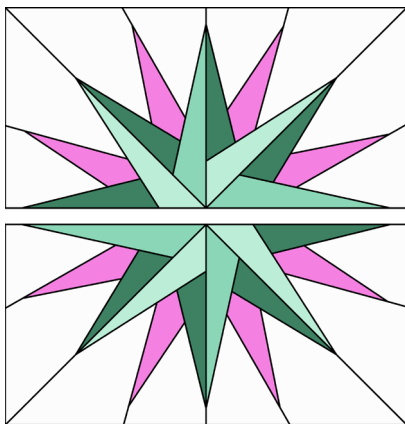
1. Remove the papers.
2. Sew RS unit to LS unit, 4 times.



3. Arrange the blocks according to diagram.

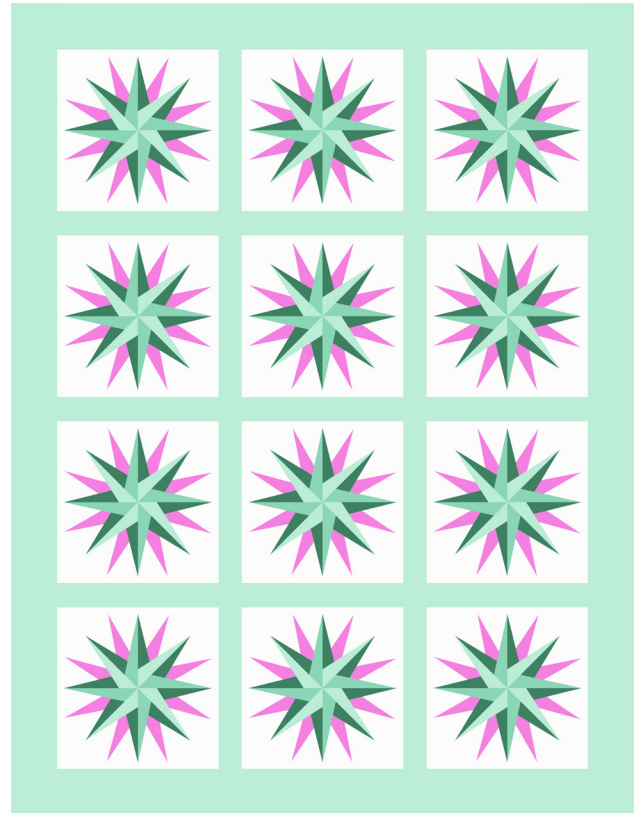


4. Sew the top and bottom rows together.

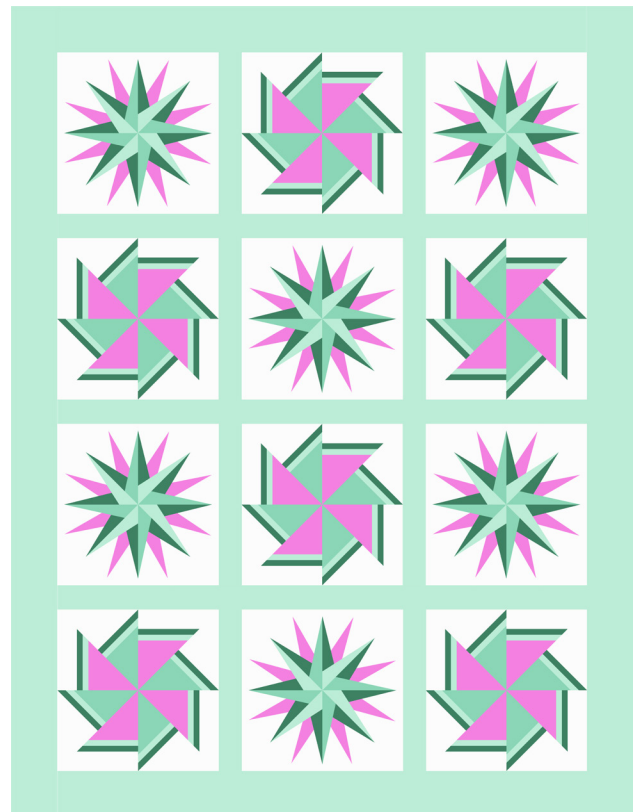


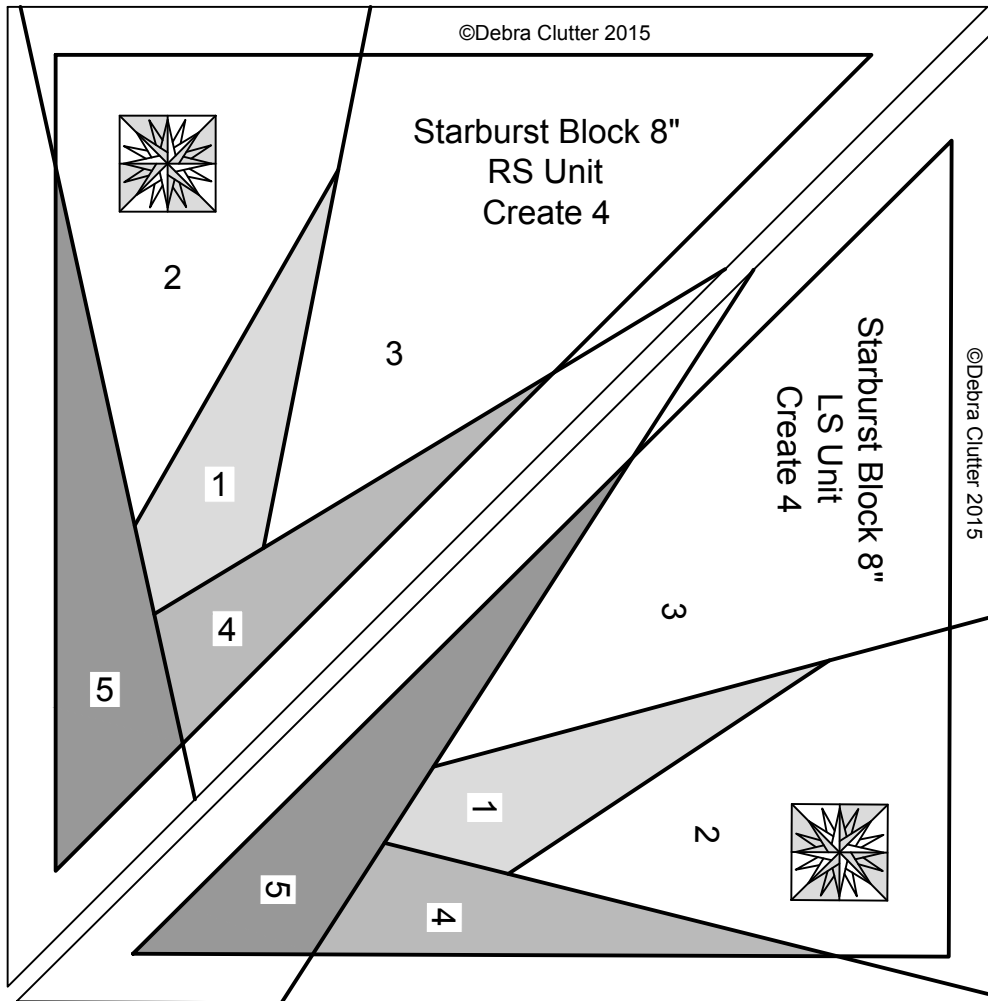
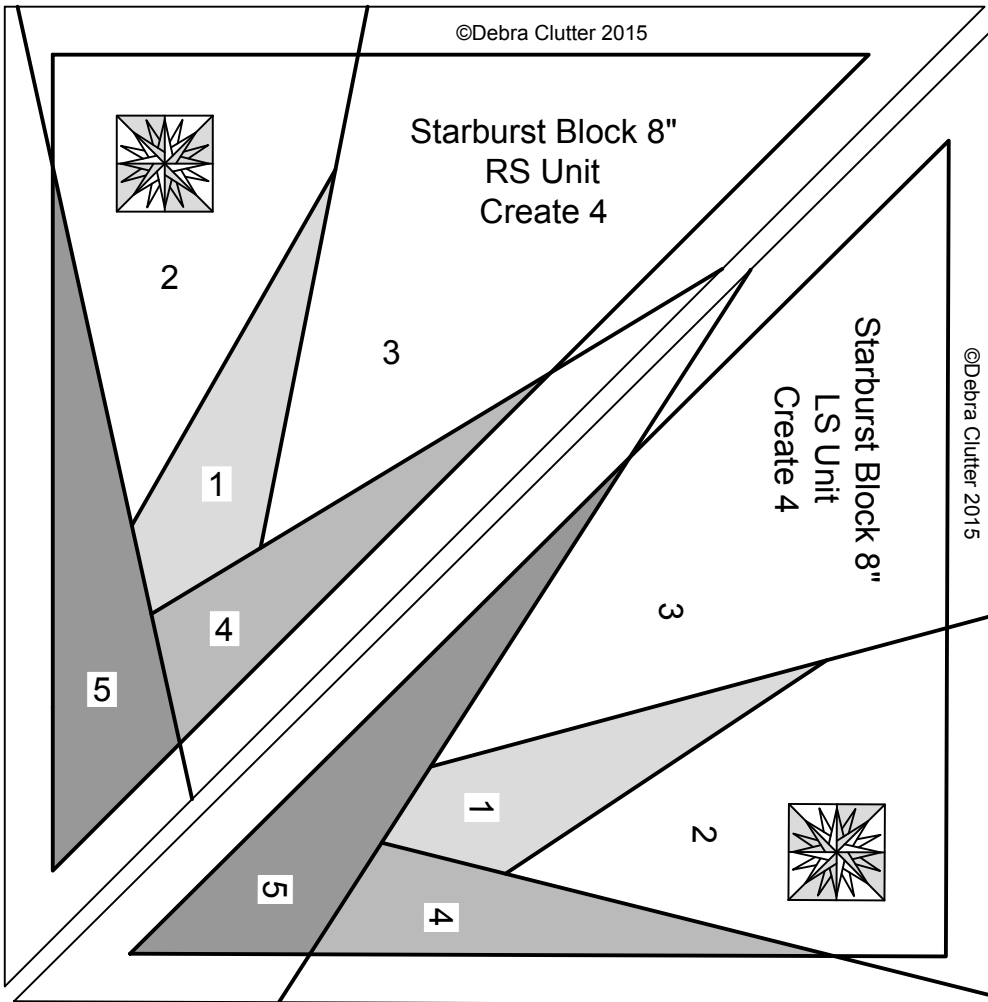
5. Sew the two halves together to complete the block.

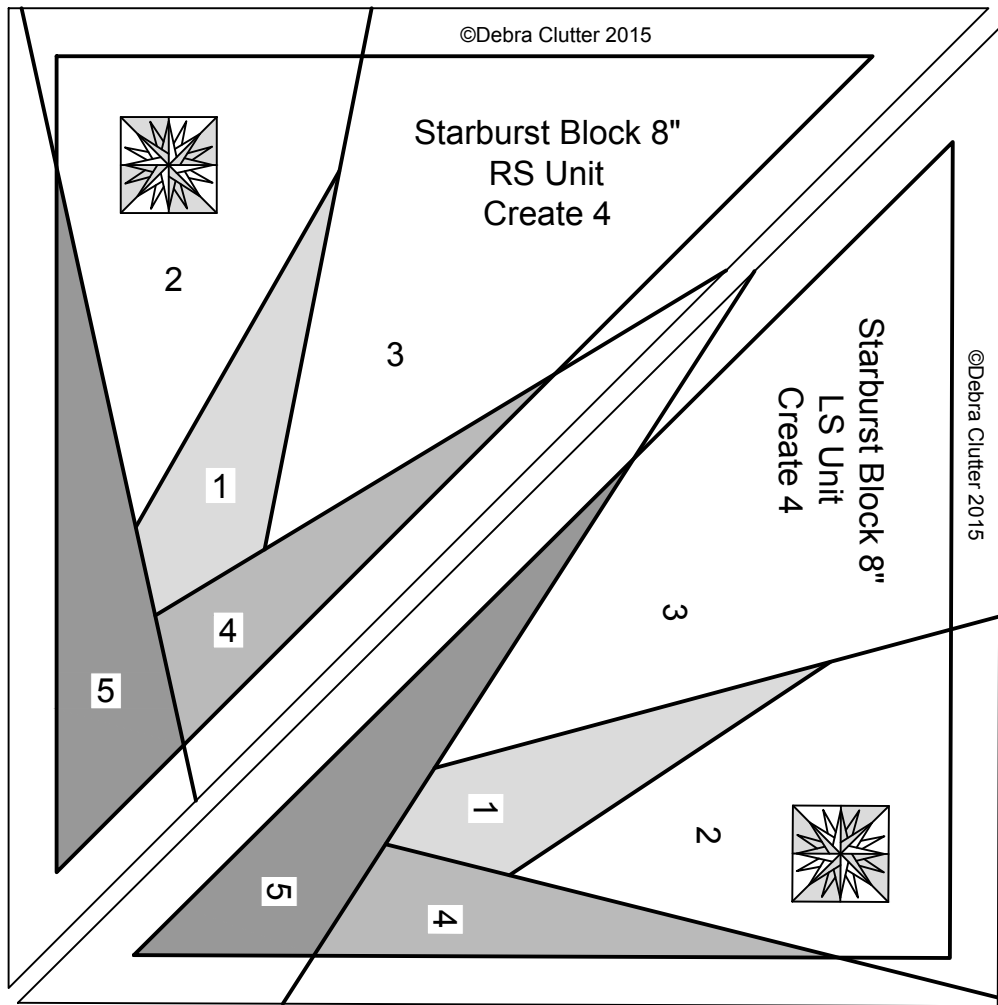
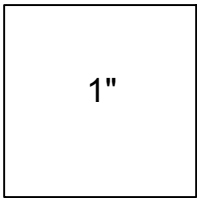
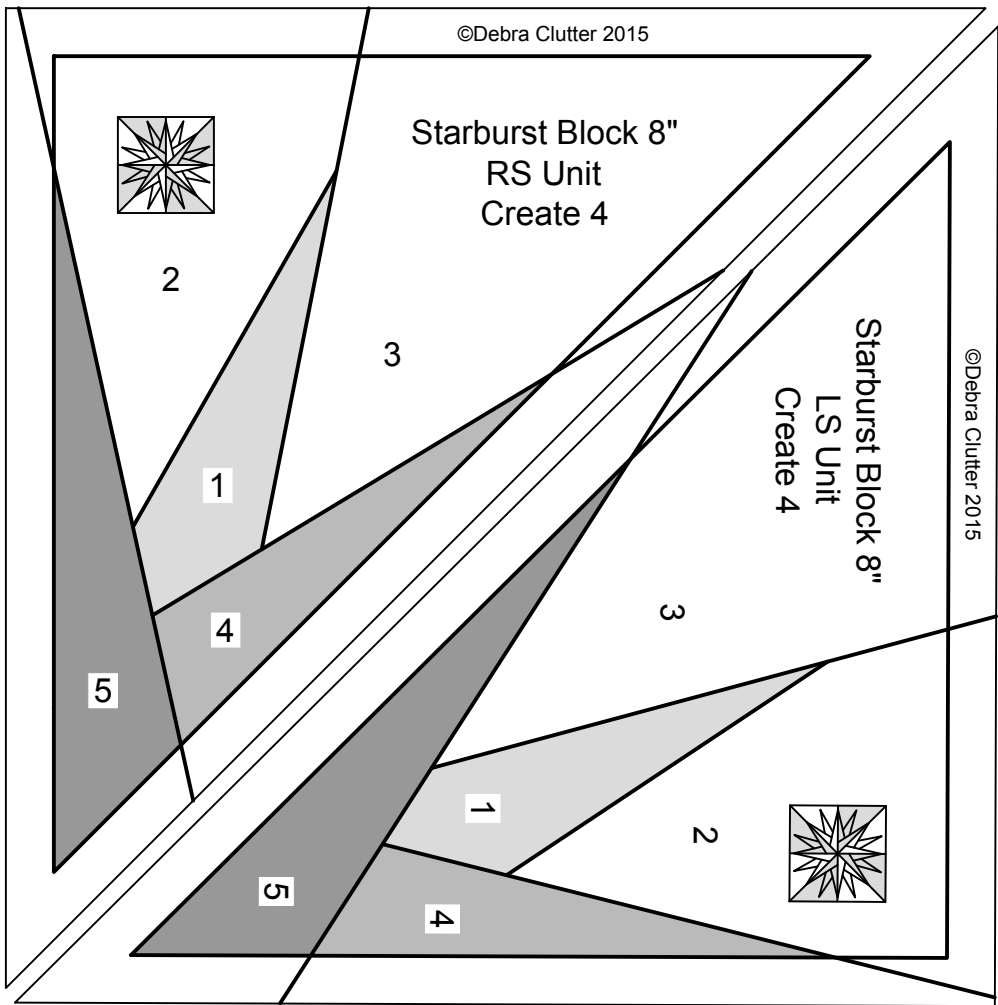
This block would work best with sashing if using the same block in a quilt. This example has 12 blocks, 2" sashing and 4" borders.

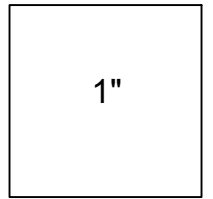
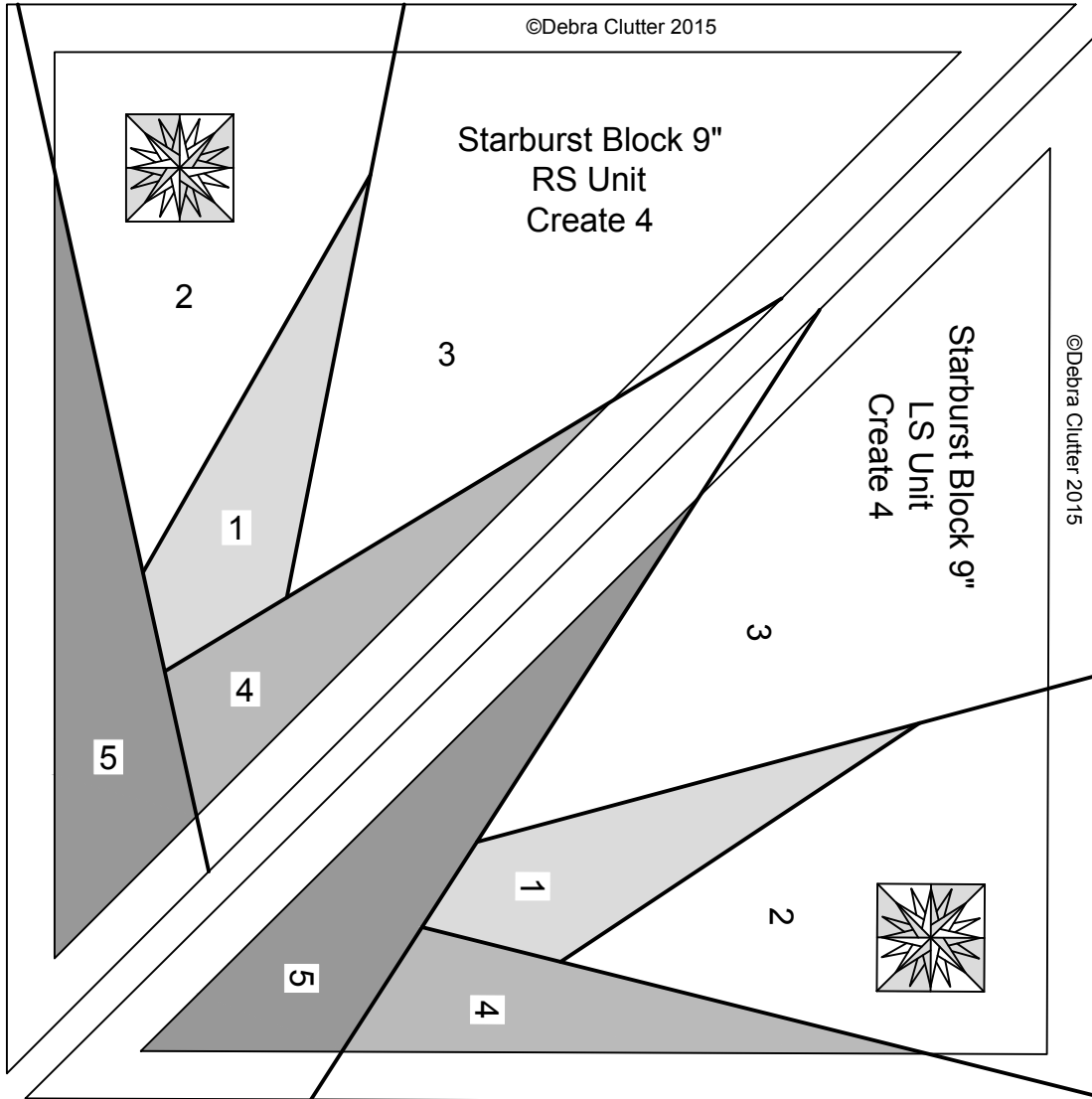


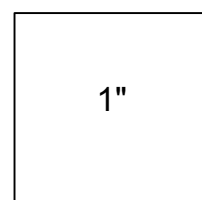
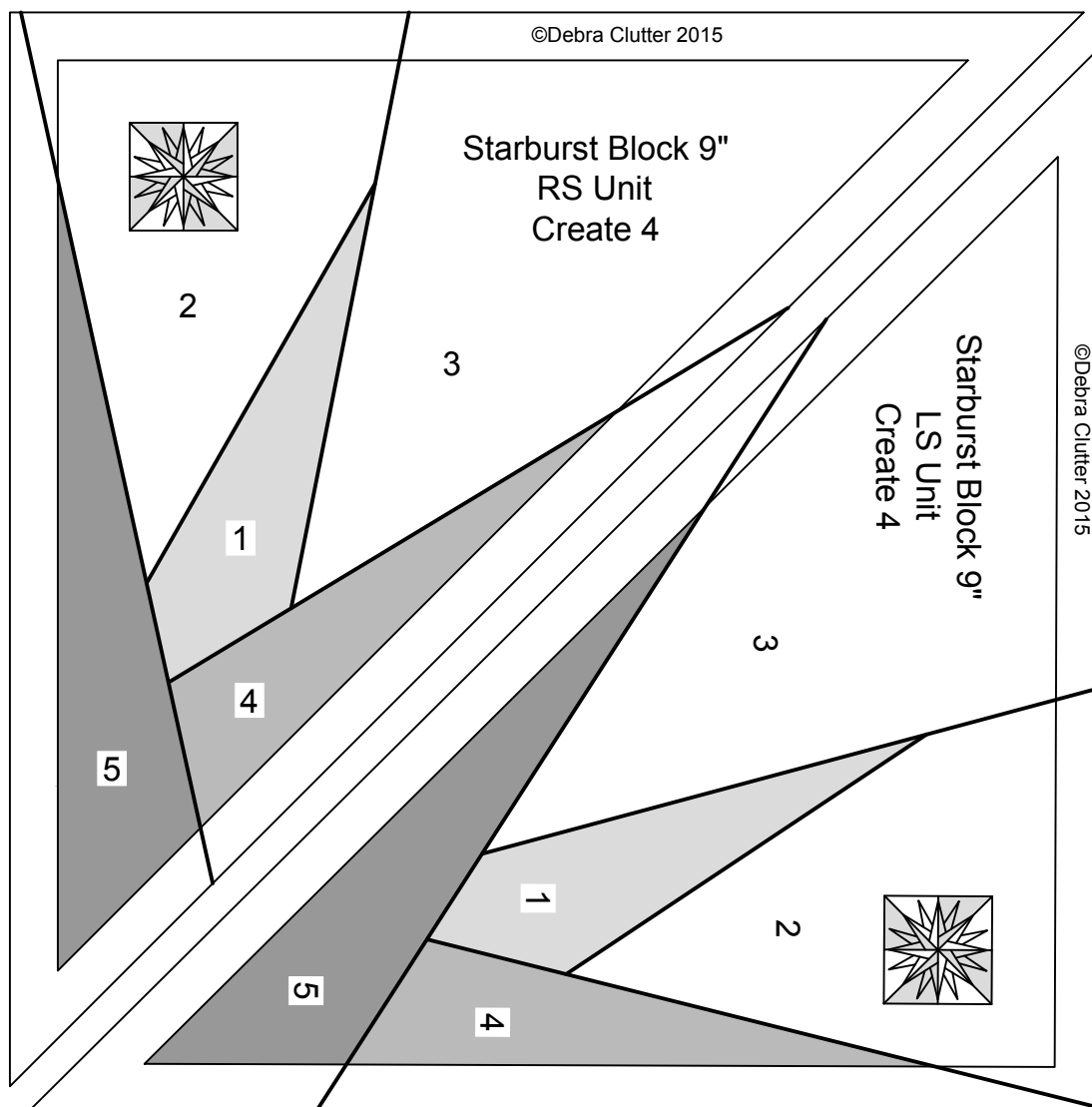
This is an example of a quilt with alternating blocks. Example has 2" sashing and 4" borders.

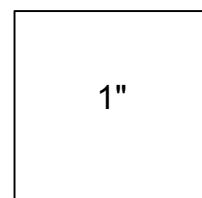
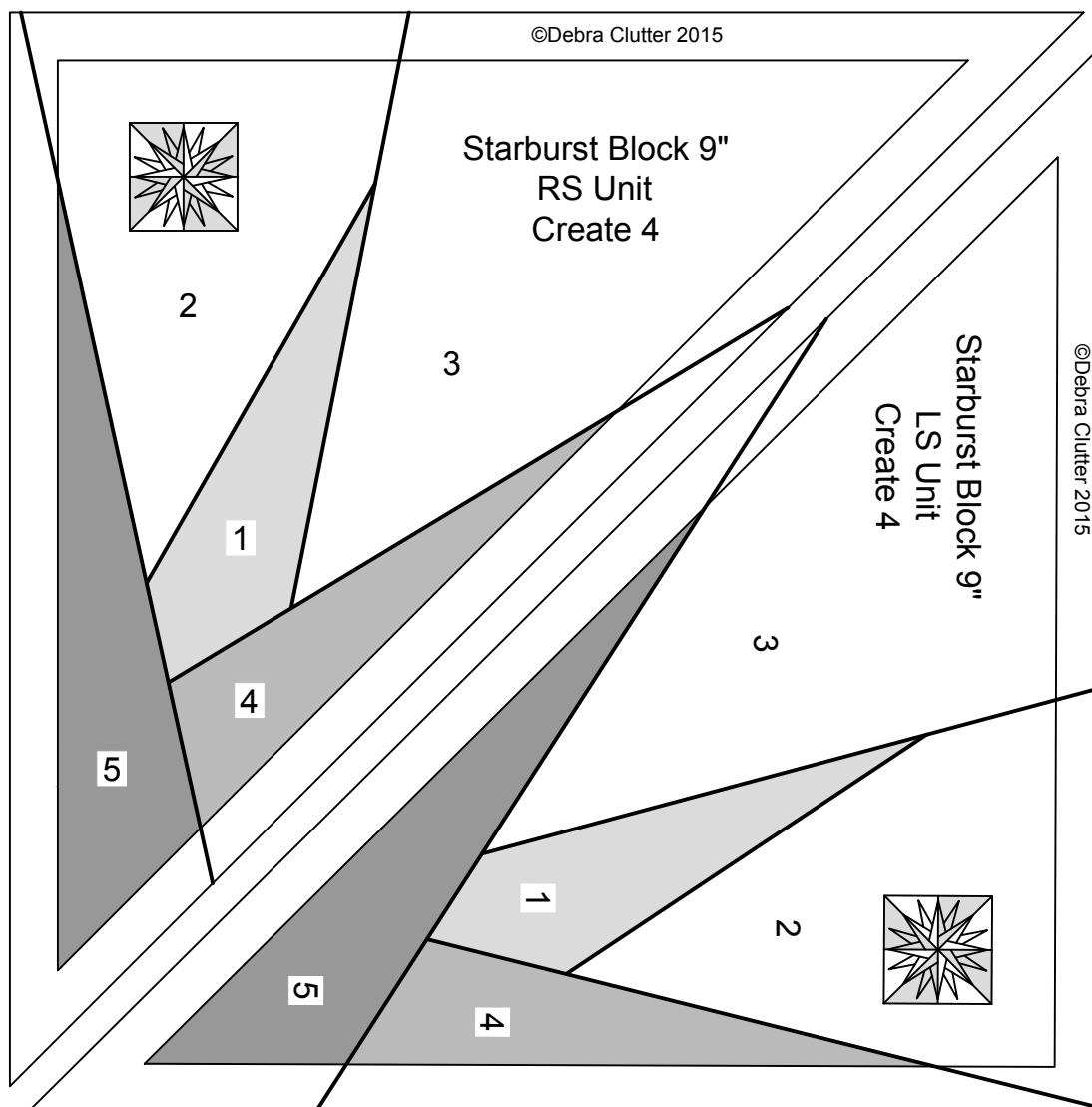


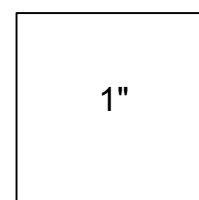
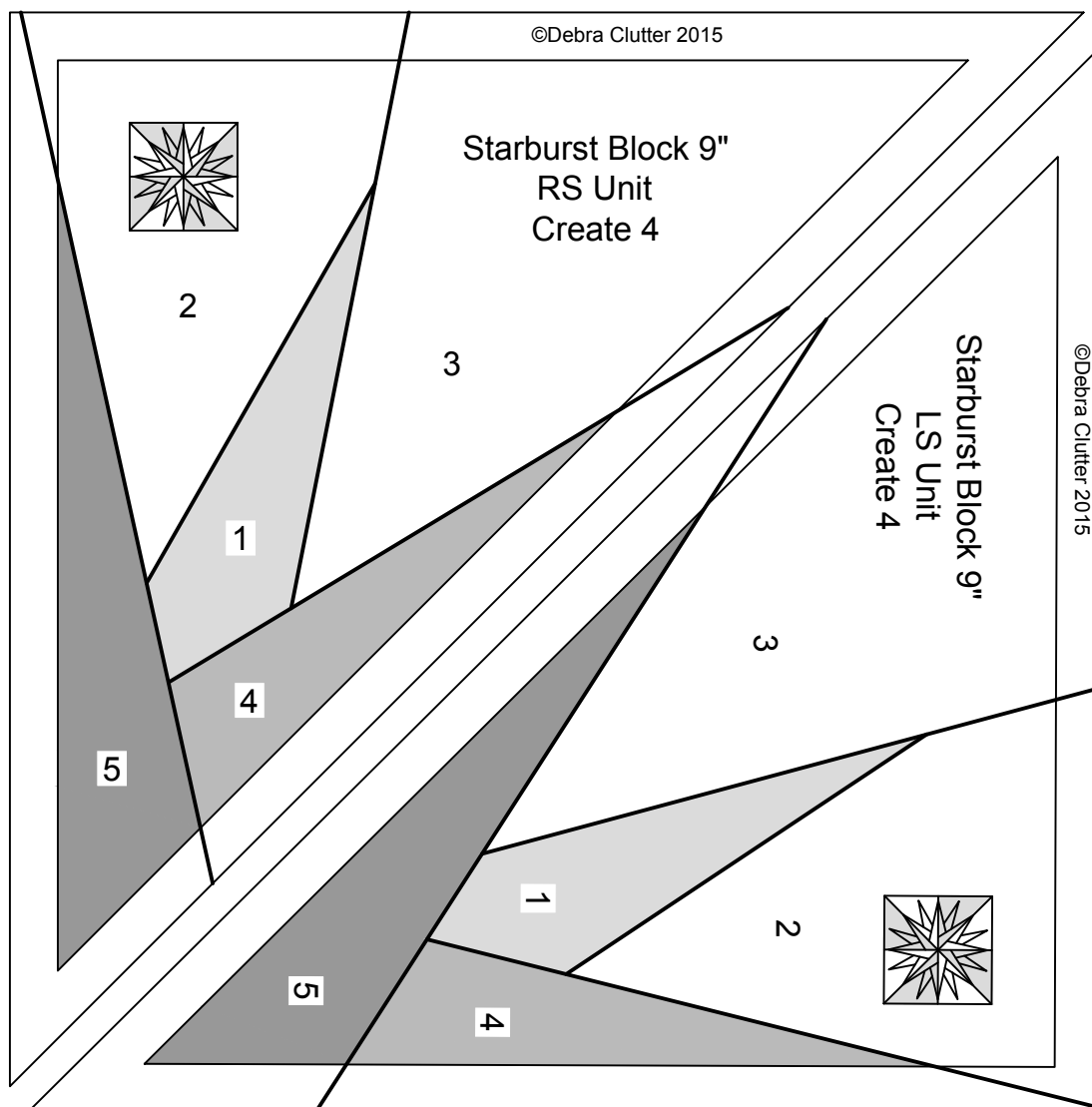


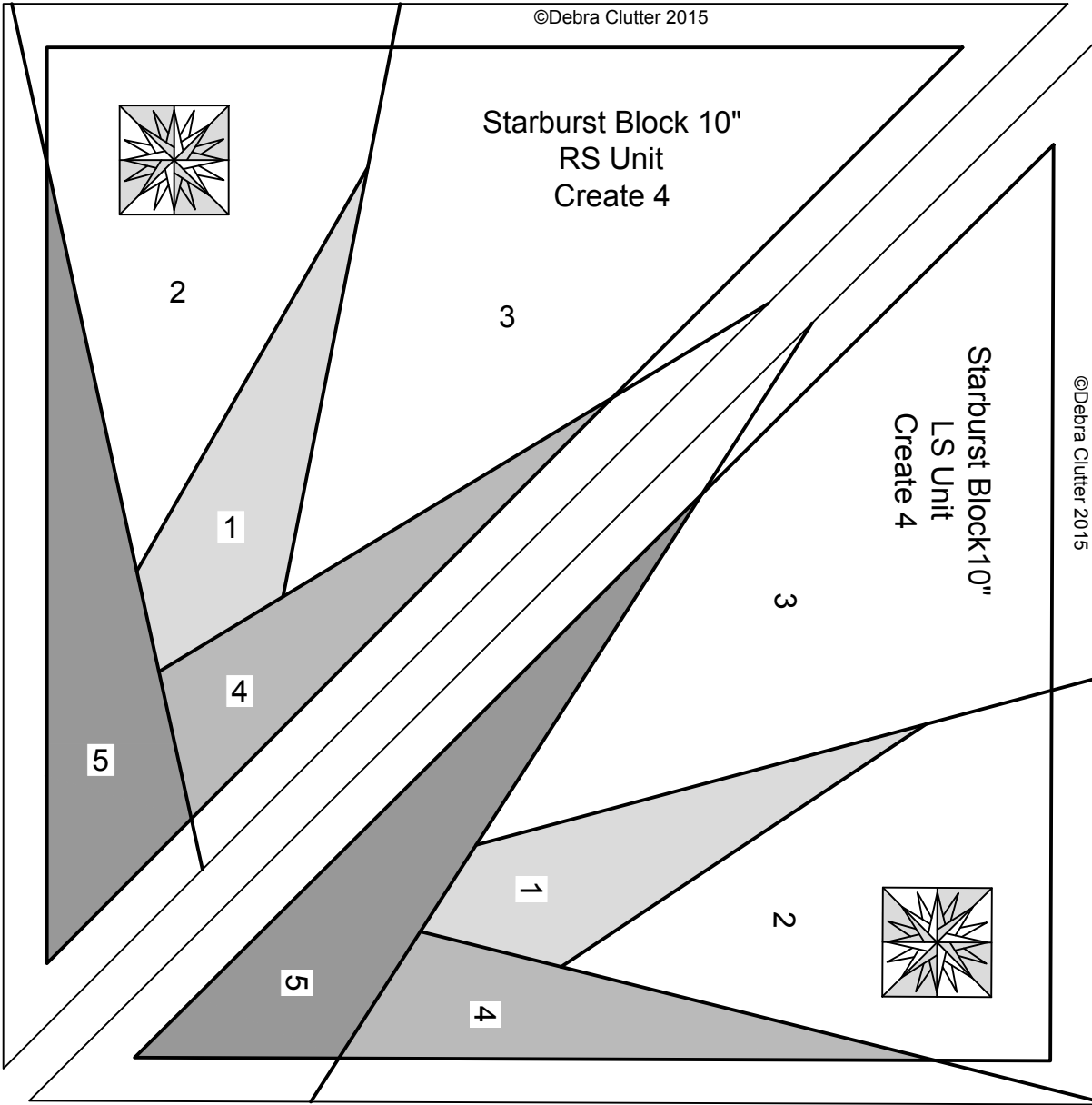


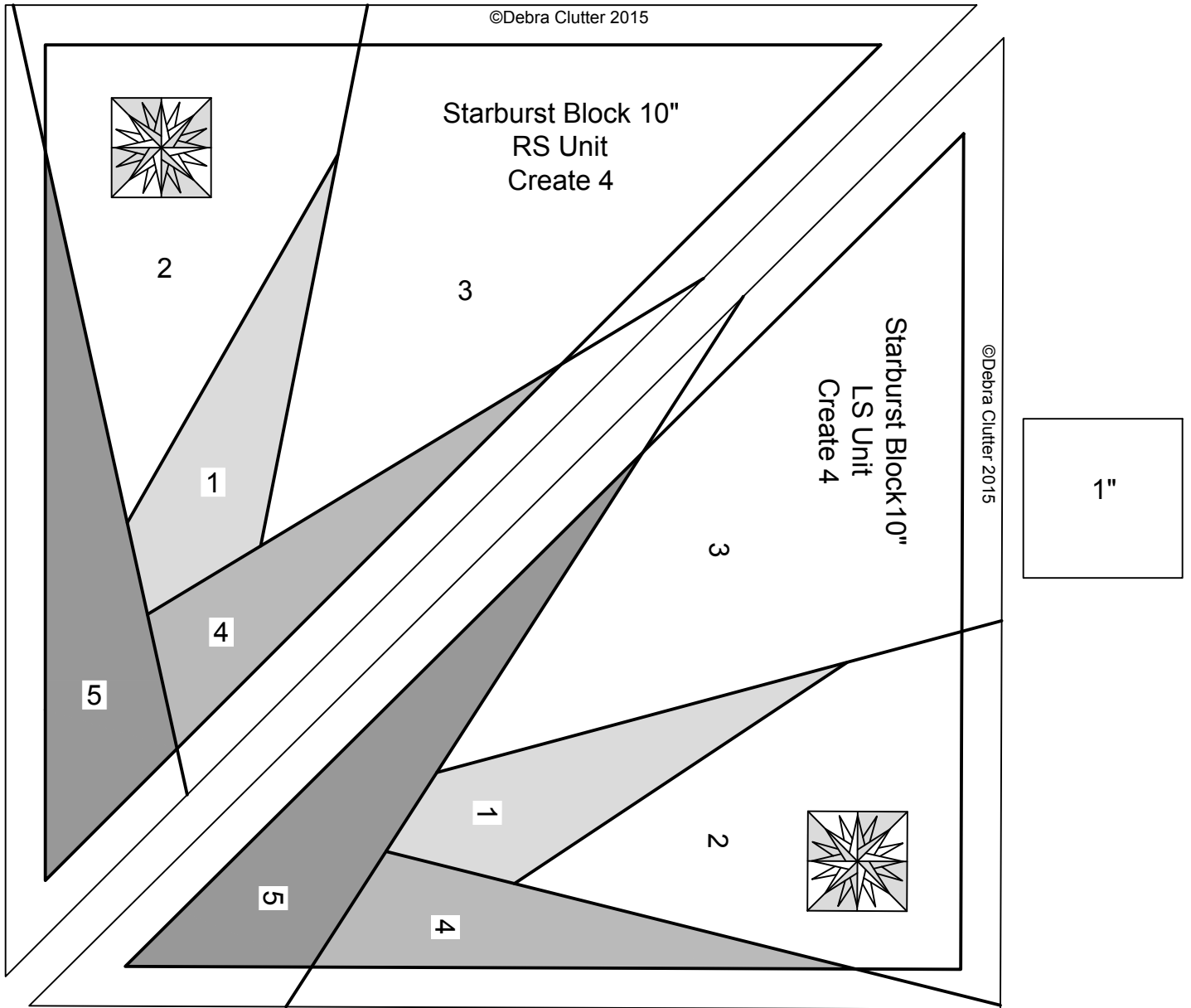


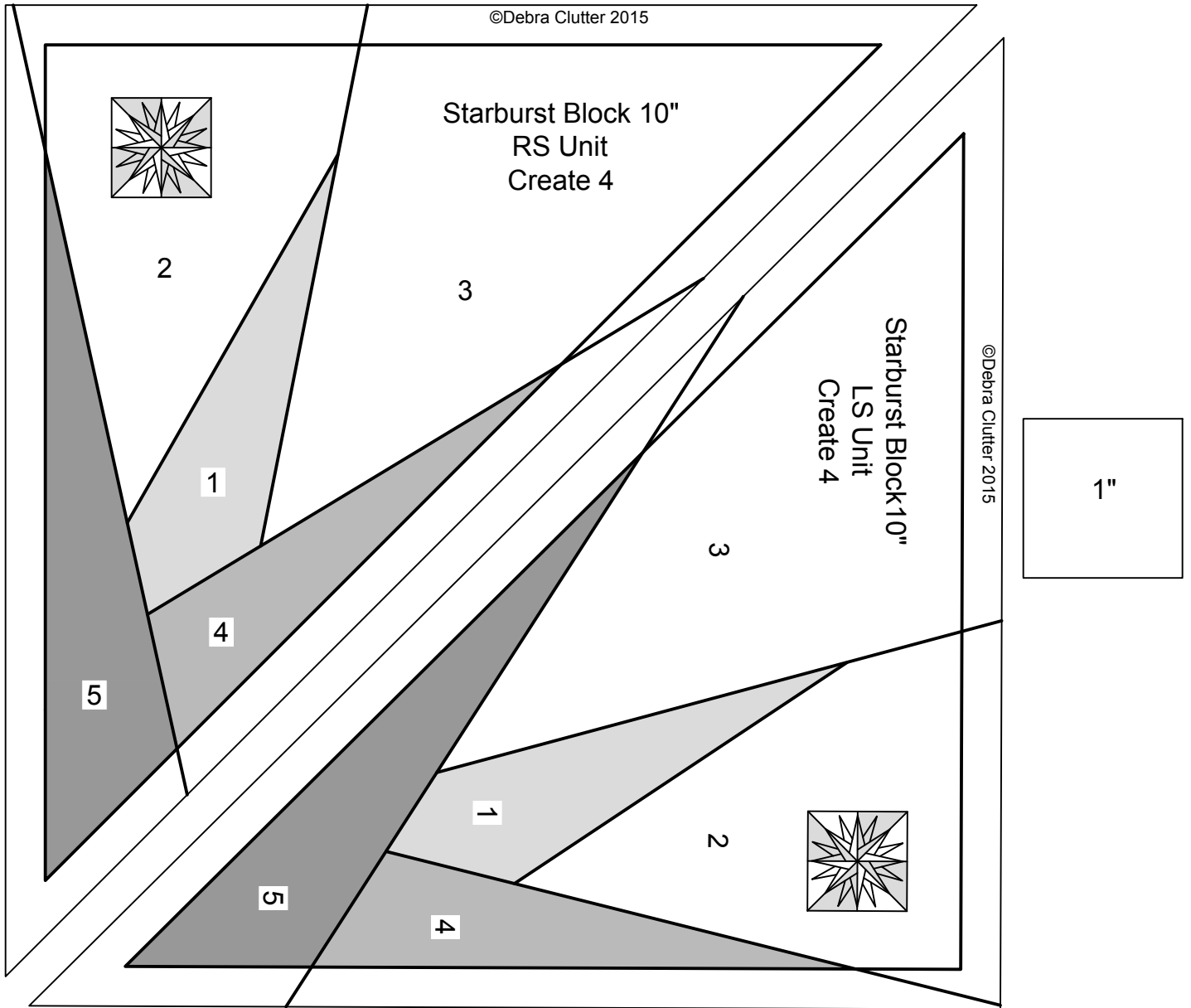


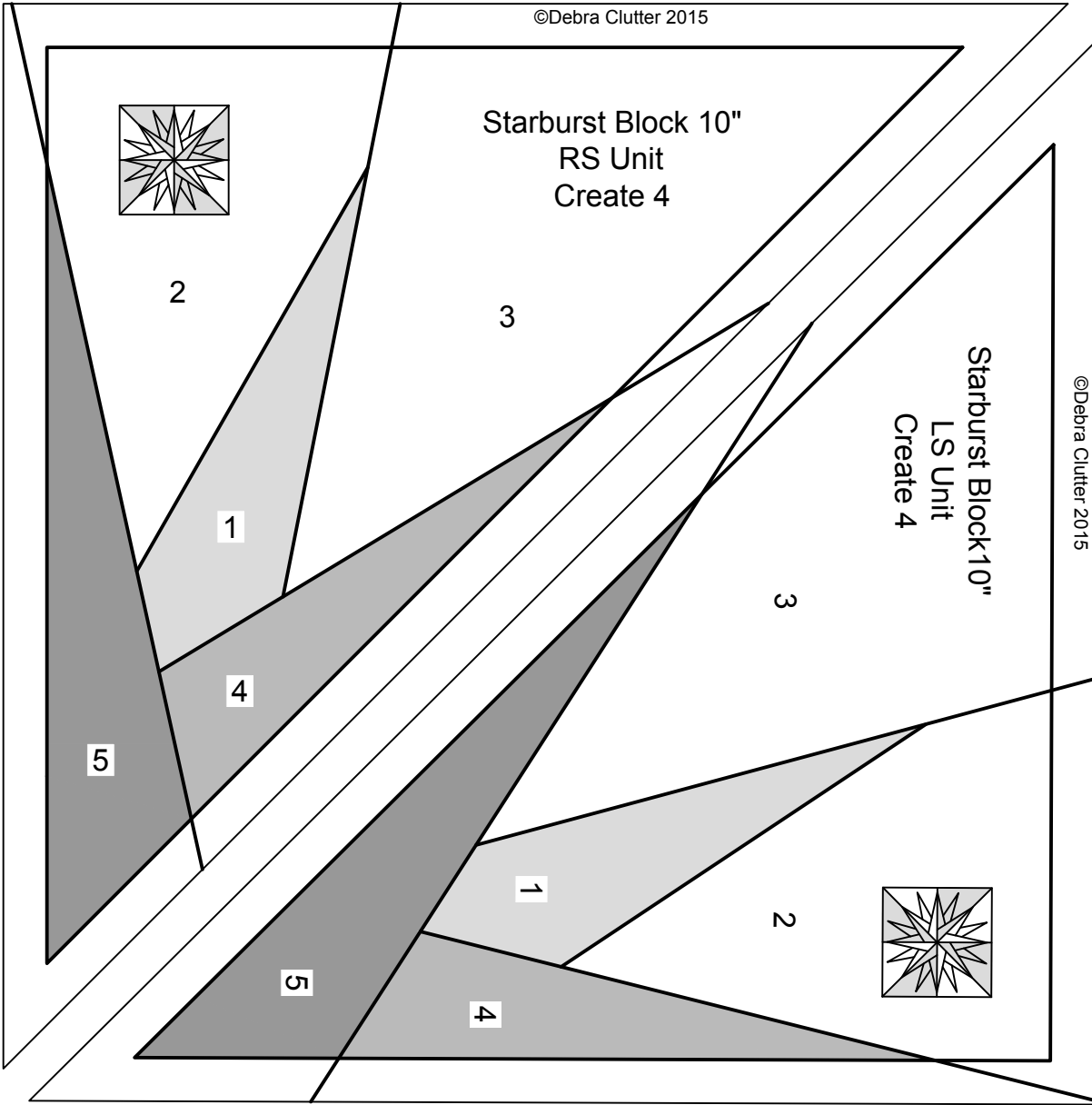






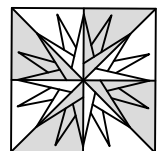
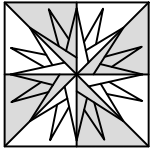
