Fabric Requirements

Background: 1-1/2 yards black for crib size
2 yards black for twin size

Binding: 1/3 yard background or contrasting fabric.

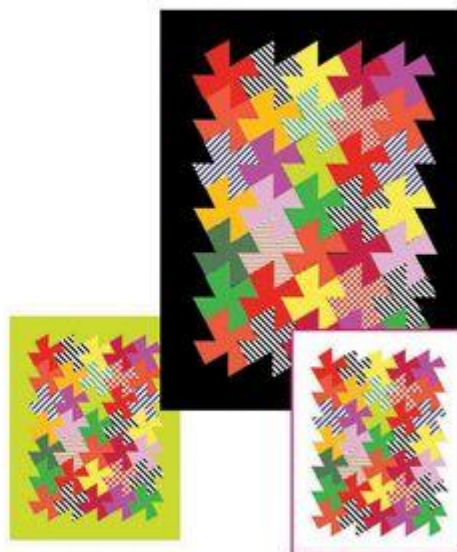
Colors: Crib Size:
8 fat quarters (each fat quarter makes 4 blocks) or 35 scrap pieces 8 inches square.
Twin Size:
22 fat quarters or 88 scrap pieces 8 inches square.

This quilt could also be made using fat eighths, since you can cut two 8 inch squares from each fat eighth.

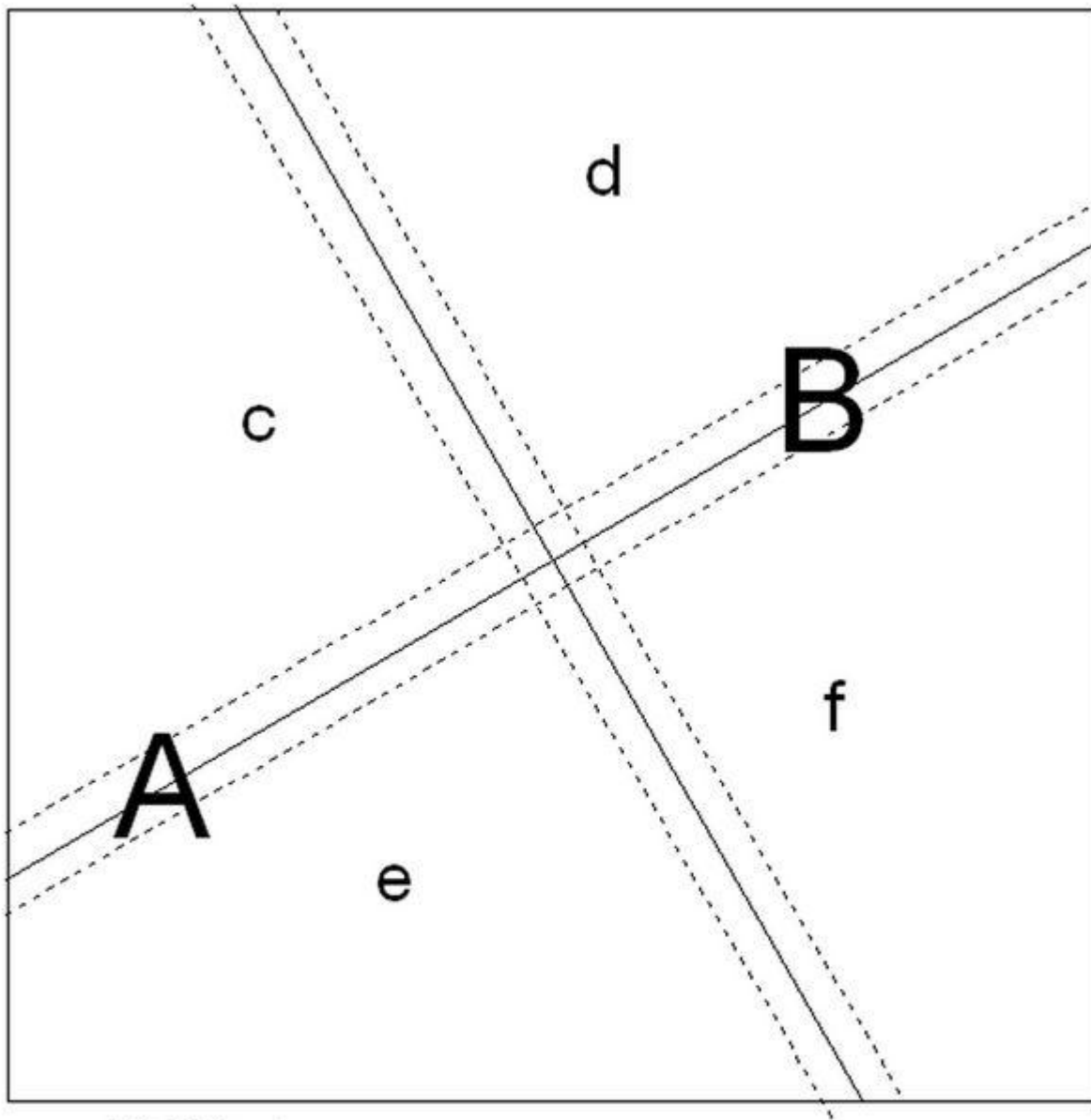
WINDMILL

Instructions for Crib and Twin size



Although I designed this quilt with a black background it would be equally as striking with either a white or colored background.



Eight inch square
Cut angle is 30 degrees

Print one copy for each stack of fabric

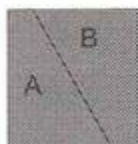
Twin size and crib size differs only in number of rows across and down. Instructions are given for crib size.

Instructions for Twin size are in bold and in parenthesis.

Quick and easy piecing of this quilt depends on the fabric being cut and stacked as shown. This enables you to complete each vertical row of the quilt without having to check on fabric placement.

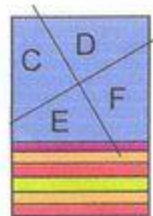
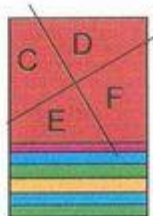
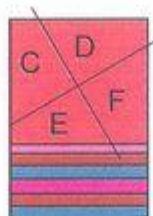
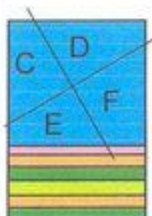
Take eight **(TWELVE)** 8 inch blocks of background fabric. Cut using template as shown.

Put the stack of eight **(TWELVE)** A's on left and the stack of eight **(TWELVE)** B's on right.

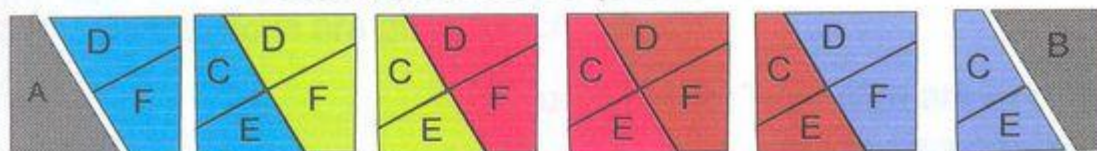


Take five **(EIGHT)** stacks of 8 inch blocks of fabric making sure matching fabrics are not touching in each stack.

Cut each stack using template as shown.



Arrange stacks as follows:

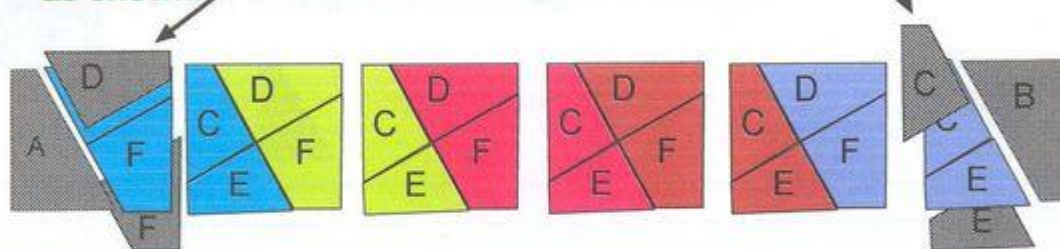


Cut one 8 inch background square using template as shown

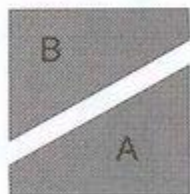


Position the D and F pieces on top and bottom of the first stack as shown.

Position the C and E pieces on the top and bottom of the last stack as shown

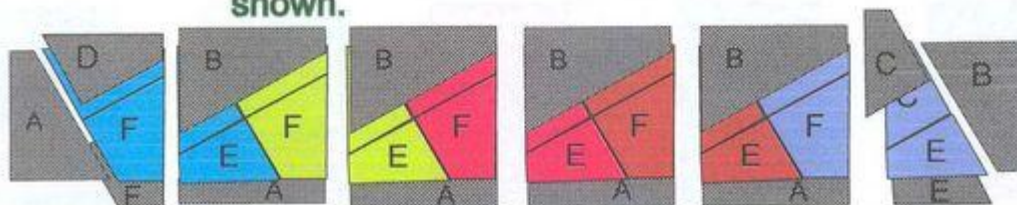


Take four (**SEVEN**) 8 inch blocks of background fabric - Cut using template as shown.

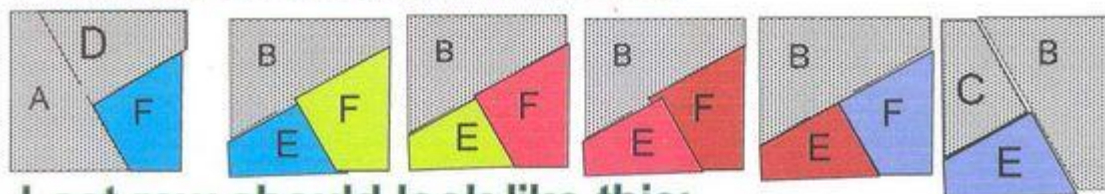


Position the B pieces on the top of the stacks as shown.

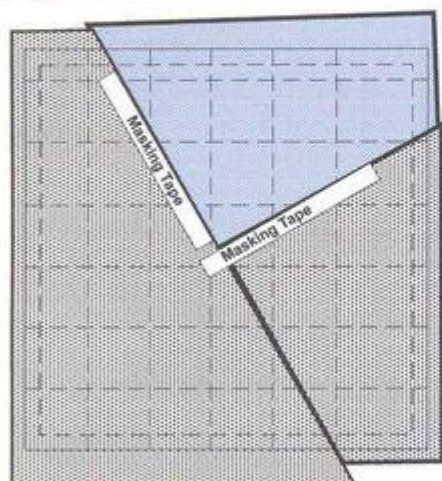
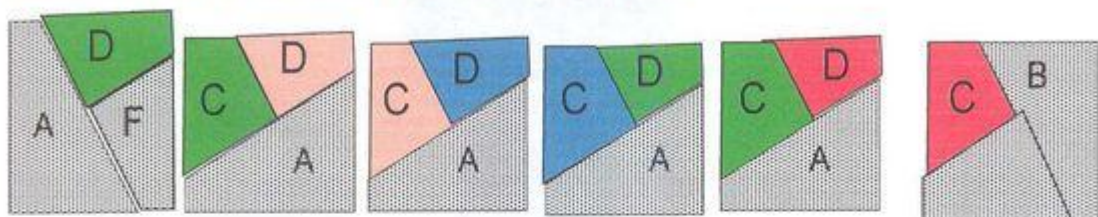
Position the A pieces on the bottom of the stacks as shown.



First row should look like this:



Last row should look like this:



**After all blocks are finished,
take a square ruler, mark
the seam lines with masking
tape and then square up all
blocks.**

**When all blocks have
been squared up and
sewn into rows add the
top and bottom borders
and then the side borders.**
